### All About Raspberries Saturday, July 19th 10:30–12 p.m. with Master Gardener Jeanette Stehr-Green

Learn everything you need to know about growing raspberries successfully on the North Olympic Peninsula with veteran Clallam County Master Gardener Jeanette Stehr-Green. The presentation will focus on red raspberries, the most common type of raspberry in the home garden, and will cover planting, fertilizing, pruning, and trellising of these varieties. The talk will also touch on yellow, black, and purple raspberries and how they (and their care) differ from



red raspberries.

Jeanette has been a Master Gardener since 2003, writes gardening articles for our local newspapers, and is a frequent speaker at Master Gardener and other educational events. She achieved Lifetime Achievement status with Clallam County Master Gardeners and received the Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award.



“All About Raspberries” will be presented rain or shine and will include a tour of the Master Gardener raspberry patch and a pruning demonstration. Please wear comfortable footwear and dress appropriately.

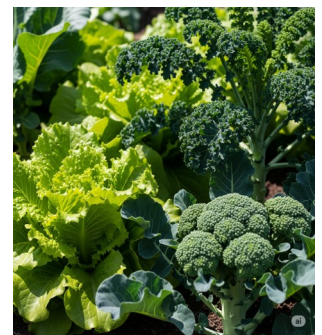
### Planning Your Fall and Winter Garden Saturday, July 26th 10:30–12 p.m. with Master Gardener Pam Pace

Join Clallam County Master Gardener Pam Pace for the Digging Deeper Saturdays presentation “Planning Your Fall/Winter Garden” to learn the tips and tricks for successful fall and winter gardening.

During her presentation, Pam will discuss the difference between fall/winter harvest crops and spring/overwintering



crops and the advantages of growing both. She will also talk about the importance of timing when planting, as well as the benefits of succession planting. Pam has done extensive research on fall and winter gardening practices, along with trial-and-error experimental gardening, and is looking forward to sharing her experiences during this “Digging Deeper” presentation.



Pam is a current Clallam County Master Gardener who, during her lifelong gardening journey, has grown vegetables, herbs, fruits and flowers in six different planting zones. She is now thrilled to be gardening on the North Olympic Peninsula.

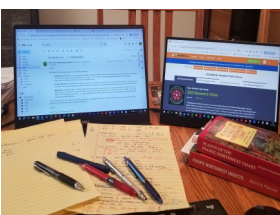
